

Notice to Eastern Region Property Owners and Commercial Users of the 2015 Fee Structure

Eastern Regional Service Board, operating as Eastern Waste Management, has adopted the 2015 budget for the delivery of waste management services and the user fee structure that will be in effect in 2015.

The user fee at the Regional Waste Management Facility located at Robin Hood Bay from April 1, 2015 to March 31, 2016 will be the following:

- **Landfill-bound materials will cost \$67.60 per metric tonne**
- **Recyclable materials will cost \$20.00 per metric tonne**

THESE FEES HAVE REMAINED THE SAME SINCE 2013 – NO CHANGE.

For the more than 22,000 households and businesses that Eastern Waste Management provides direct waste collection and recycling services, the fee per property/unit of service for January 1, 2015 to December 31, 2015 will be \$180.00.

Residents of the Eastern Region do not pay fees at the Waste Recovery Facilities, the Residential Drop Off site or Household Hazardous Waste sites/collection events. These facilities and services are free as long as residents comply with the requirements for these facilities/services. No commercial waste is accepted at the Residential Drop Off and the Household Hazardous Waste facility at Robin Hood Bay, nor is it accepted at the Waste Recovery Facilities or the mobile Household Hazardous Waste collection events.

For the convenience of residential users, Waste Recovery Facilities that accept bulk residential items such as appliances, construction and demolition materials, tires, metals, furniture, etc. have been constructed at Bay Bulls, Renew's-Cappahayden, St. Joseph's, Placentia, Sunnyside, Cavendish, Old Perlican and Harbour Grace. An additional facility is proposed for the Whitbourne area (location and opening date TBD).

The Waste Recovery Facilities and the Residential Drop Off are open to any resident of the Eastern Region. The Residential Drop Off at Robin Hood Bay is open every Tuesday to Saturday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., except on statutory holidays. The Waste Recovery Facilities are open Tuesday and Thursday from 12 noon to 4 p.m. and Saturday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The Board is in the process of constructing a Transfer Station (CTS) on the former Clarenville Landfill that is expected to begin operating in the Fall of 2015. Once the CTS starts operating, all waste in the area will be transported to the regional landfill at Robin Hood Bay.

Communities can collect household hazardous waste (HHW) material within their communities and bring these to the HHW Facility at the Regional Waste Management Facility located at Robin Hood Bay for proper disposal (prior approval required). Eastern Waste Management also offers 30 HHW collection events each year in cooperation with volunteer fire departments across the region.
